

Design of Couple's HL23 Apartment Inspired by HL23 Itself



Neil Denari's **HL23** hovers over the High Line, the inner lives of its residents visible to the elevated park's many visitors. Some HL23 apartment owners embrace their lives in the fishbowl, approaching their interior design as performance art; others care less about passersby than about how the look of their homes relates to the architecture of the building itself. Geraldine and Kit Laybourne are two of the latter type of buyer. They purchased a high-floor apartment in HL23 and consulted with Denari and designer Rick Michod (of Denari's firm) before making some changes to the space: taking away one of the unit's three bedrooms, opening up the kitchen space, and replacing the original kitchen with one in yellow and gray.
